County Executive Lamont McClure will be presenting a check to the Borough for a CDBG Grant! Issue from Resident Mary getting hold of the inspection company to handle the issue with her neighbor's fence which is an eye soar.

Resident on New Street would like Council to consider placing speed bumps on New street due to speeding traffic. Council President explained that the speeding issue is everywhere and a traffic study would need o be done. Item will be placed on the next agenda.

Resident Brian addressed his concerns with fireworks in the 900 block of Karoly and noted restrictions. He would like Council to make an ordinance. Borough Manager replied that due to the current ordinance, a few properties have the allowable square footage to be within guidelines. Brian was instructed to call the non-emergency number so they could locate the exact address and cite under the state statue.

Resident Patrick Esposito stated his concerns with the speed bumps and 2 stop signs proposed to go on Main Street and suggested starting with the stop signs first. Council President stated that the humps will not go in until next year and that they will be 300 ft apart and will be monitored and adjusted if needed. Patrick also inquired about relinquishing the sanitation carts he currently has and getting a dumpster. Council President replied that only a 4-unit residence or more is exempt from the sanitation contract.

Council Member Charles Derr had a general discussion about the Santa Run.

Council Member Monica Elliott inquired if a lock can be placed on the Fire Department door.

Resident Mary stated she would take in any stray dogs the Police Department found.
